- 3. Recruit your crew. Your video will look better if you ask someone else to record it for you. No selfie videos, please.

Portrait

- 1. Film in portrait mode. Have your friend hold the phone in portrait mode rather than in landscape mode while filming.
- 2. Keep it brief. Your video should be no longer than 45 seconds. Feel free to try again until you get the perfect take.
- 3. Be creative. Let your imagination be your guide. Want to create a video that includes the latest TikTok trend? We'd love to see it! Want to incorporate program families into your video? Go for it!

- **1.** Avoid editing. Try not to use filters, light adjustments or other editing techniques with your video.
