Wonderopolis® free online learning alternative for coronavirus closures

Louisville, KY (March 13, 2020)—The COVID-19 virus has prompted increased safety measures across the country, including the closing of an increasing number of school districts. As of today, over 1,500 schools have closed or are scheduled to close, affecting over one million students, according to *Education Week*.

As parents and educators search for alternative resources during these closures, digital tools can offer solutions.

In as little as 30 minutes a day, these activities reinforce the content learned, while building background knowledge and vocabulary skills. With multi-disciplinary content that purposefully aligns with educational standards, the STEM Educational Quality Framework, and Bloom's Digital Taxonomy, Wonderopolis easily integrates into K-12 curriculums across the country.

In 2019, Wonderopolis became the first nonprofit entity to feature Microsoft's Immersive Reader, a new technology that expands content accessibility through a variety of reading assistance features. With Immersive Reader, Wonderopolis' content is translatable into more than 60 languages via text and text-to-speech. Content also includes language-specific accents, line focusing, text resizing, syllable breakdown, parts of speech identification, and a picture dictionary. Students can easily engage with Wonderopolis content individually regardless of their location or background.

"Wonderopolis is such a dynamic and powerful tool for individual learning," said NCFL President and Founder Sharon Darling. "Students can learn in their own language at their own pace, building vocabulary skills and background knowledge that is vital to succeeding in today's world. This free resource has great potential for families and students outside of the classroom."
